Summer School 2018!

How do I know if I need Summer School?

- Talk to your Counselor first!
- Check your transcript!
- If you failed a required course to graduate, you can repeat it in summer school.
- If you earned a “D” or “F” in a required “college prep” course then you may be able to repeat the course in summer (**college prep courses are listed on your transcript with a “p” next to them**). **Check the course catalog!**

Summer School Options

- **IUSD Summer School @University HS**
 - Seat-based courses, mostly for remediation, limited enrichment courses, some advancement
- **IUSD Blended Learning Summer School @SJHS**
 - Meet in-person, one (more) x a week with remainder of coursework completed online, remediation & advancement
- **ROP Summer Courses**
 - Elective credit, enrichment, career focused – see Mrs. Winter in Counseling to enroll
- **IPSF Summer Enrichment Courses**
 - Enrichment only – <https://portal.ipsfacademy.org/>
- **IVC/IUSD Summer College Program**
 - For enrichment and college credit - <http://admissions.ivc.edu/IUSD>

- Summer school is 6 weeks

Q: Our family is planning a trip during the Summer School session. Can our student miss more than 3 days of class?

A: No. There are no exceptions to the Summer School attendance policy.

- For seat-based classes at WHS, students are only allowed 3 absences per class. Upon the 4th absence they are immediately dropped from the course.
- For Blended Learning classes, students are only allowed 1 absence per class with pre-approval from the instructor. Upon the 2nd absence they are immediately dropped from the course.

Summer School Registration Information:

- IUSD offers limited advancement and enrichment classes to students (i.e. , PE , Art, Creative Writing, Coll Prep Composition, Chemistry, Driver's Ed, Health). If enough students have an interest in the courses -and- if IUSD receives enough donations the courses will be offered.

How to register:

Items to bring to in-person registration:

- Course Request and Confirmation Page with appropriate signatures: Parent, student, and teacher (if required.)
- Donation
- What if I forgot to print out my confirmation page when I submitted the online registration form? Please check your email (spam & junk folders) as you will receive an email confirmation that you can print out.

SUMMER SCHOOL REGISTRATION...

AS EASY AS

- 1. Log onto iUSD.org** and click on the summer school registration button.
- Choose courses** Make sure course selections do not conflict. If on different campuses, make sure you have time to get from one location to the other.
- Print** the confirmation page at the end of the process. **Bring it,** along with any donation you wish to make, **to one of the registration days** listed in the course catalog.



Remember to choose your classes wisely and talk to your counselor if necessary. Some classes require a teacher, coordinator, or counselor signature, so please make sure you get those before coming to a registration location.

What is a suggested Donation for Summer School?

- Under each course in the course catalog, you will see a suggested donation amount.
- Suggested donations: \$150, \$275, & \$550 each
- A suggested donation is based on whether we will receive supplemental funding, cost of the instructor, materials, facilities, and credits allotted

Where do I turn in my Summer School Registration forms?

- If needed, parents and students can register at any of the registration sites for either SJHS (CEC) or UHS summer school. However, it is recommended you register at your own school site.
- Students can attend summer school at both SJHS (CEC) and UHS. However, students must ensure the schedule does not conflict. Remember a max of 2 classes can be taken total.
 - 1 class at UHS and 1 class at SJHS
 - 2 classes at UHS
 - 2 classes at SJHS

What if my class is canceled ?
