10th grade planning conferences

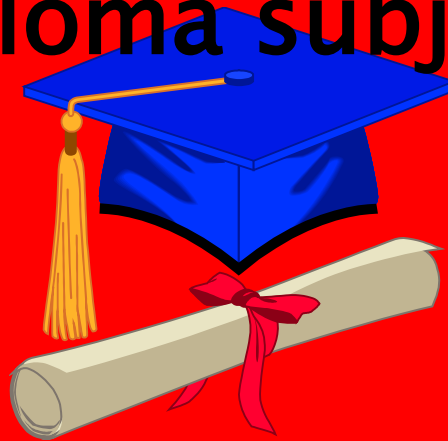
**675 sophomores! = small group conferences

PSAT 9 results & design a 4 year plan**

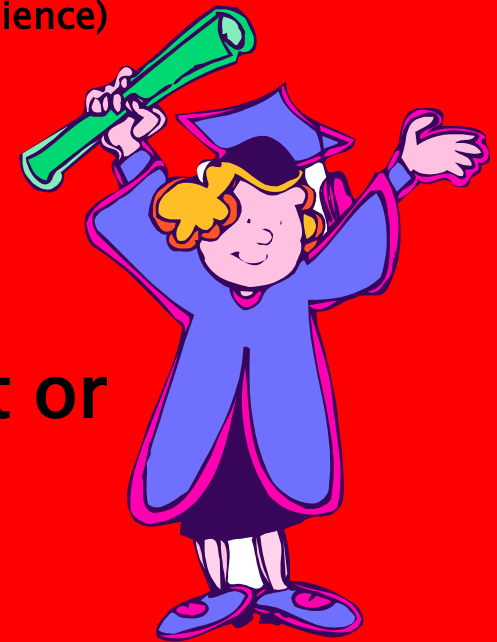
Graduation Requirements

- ▶ Complete diploma subject requirements



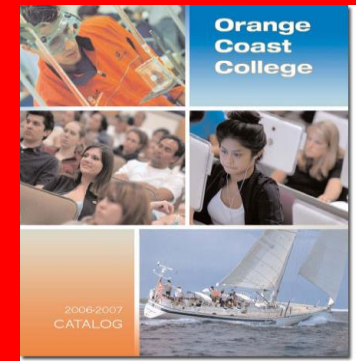
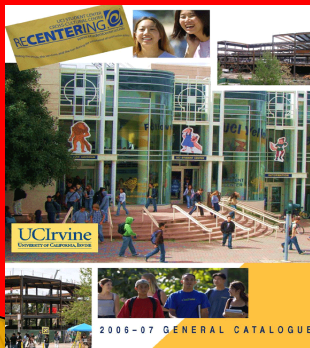
WHS Subject Requirements

- ▶ 4 years English
- ▶ Math 1 and 1 more year of math
- ▶ 2 years of Science (Life Science and Physical Science)
- ▶ World History 1 year
- ▶ US History 1 year
- ▶ Political Science and Economics
- ▶ 1 year Foreign Language, Fine Art or
 - Tech Ed
- ▶ 2 years PE
- ▶ 1 semester Health
- ▶ Additional courses to equal 215 credits



Options for CA Post High School Education

- ▶ Community College - 2 yr.
- ▶ Cal State System – 4 yr.
- ▶ UC System – 4yr.
- ▶ Private 2 & 4 yr.



Class of 2019 Post High School Plans

- ▶ 96% planned to pursue a post high school education.
- ▶ 66% of grads met CA public university entrance requirements (A–G) for the CSU or UC

- ▶ 21% attend the University of California
- ▶ 10% attend the California State University
- ▶ 15% attend a private university
- ▶ 6% attend an out-of-state public university
- ▶ 44% attend a community college or technical school
- ▶ 1% attend international universities
- ▶ 3% Other: military, work, gap year, or undecided

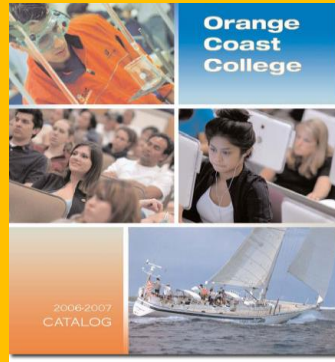

Community College

Admission requirement – must be 18 or a high school graduate, or pass the CHSPE

No entrance exam such as the SAT or ACT is required

Certificate Programs, Associate Degrees, and GUARANTEED Transfer Programs (TAG)

Honors programs

4 year CA Public Universities

- ▶ General Eligibility Requirements include:
 - ▶ 1. Qualifying GPA (10th – 11th weighed)
 - ▶ 2. Qualifying score on an entrance exam either the SAT or the ACT
 - ▶ 3. “A –G” subject requirements (C or better)

Information on Entrance Exams

IUSD sponsored testing includes the following:

PSAT 9 – 9th grade

PACT – 10th grade

Official PSAT in 11th Grade. (October)

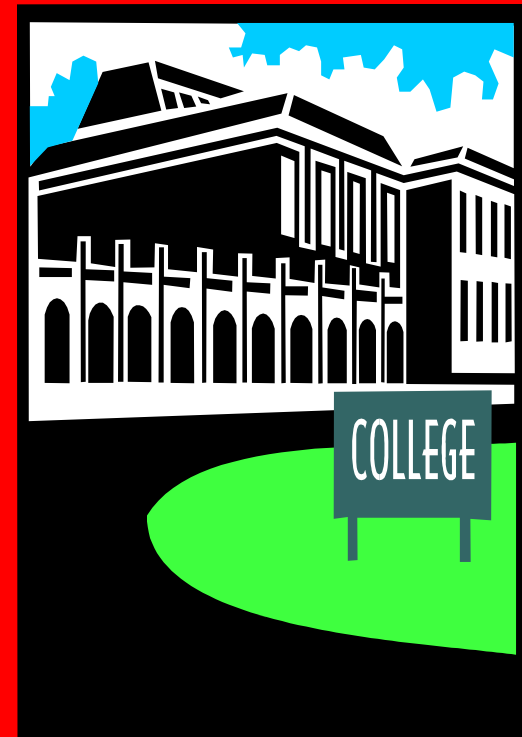
Official SAT and or ACT – typically begin testing in 11th grade. Finish testing by Nov/Dec of 12th grade.



What are the A–G Subject Requirements?

- A. 4 years *College Prep English*
- B. 3 years *Math 1 through Math 3*
- C. 2 years *Lab Science*
- D. 2 years *Social Science*
including *World History*
US History/Poli Sci
- E. 1 year *Visual or Performing Art*
- F. 2 years *Foreign Language or*
Language other than English
- G. 1 year *Academic Elective*

*Minimum of 15 required classes
& must have a “C–” or better in
all required classes*



CSU Campuses



California State University

23 Campuses - range in size from small to large and stretches 800 miles from Humboldt in the north to San Diego in the south

Is the nation's largest four-year public University system

Target student - the top 20% of high school students in CA

Tuition cost = approximately \$7500 per year

California State University

- ▶ Admit using 10th/11th grade academic GPA (2.0 & above) & a qualifying test score from the ACT or SAT.
- ▶ Complete the A–G requirements with C's or better
- ▶ ACT or SAT Test to be completed no later than fall of senior year (Dec.)
- ▶ Apply between October 1 and November 30

University of California



University of California

- ▶ 9 undergraduate campuses across the state
- ▶ Target student– the top 10% of the high school students in CA
- ▶ Known for their strong undergraduate and graduate programs
- ▶ Tuition cost = approximately \$15,000 per year

University of California

- 1) 10th & 11th grade academic gpa of 3.0 GPA or better in your “a-g” requirement subjects
- 2) Qualifying ACT with writing or SAT test score with essay to be completed no later than fall of senior year (Dec.)
- 3) Applications go through a “comprehensive review” which includes: *Grades, Courses, Test Scores, Personal Insight Questions, Quality of senior year program, Promise for leadership, Special talents, achievements, awards, community service*

Private and Out of State Public Universities



Public Out of State & Private Universities

Public Out of State: Tuition costs = add out of state fees

University of Washington, University of North Carolina, U of Arizona

Washington State, North Carolina State, Arizona State,

Private: Tuition Cost = 20,000 to 50,000 per year

Ivy League Schools, Stanford, USC, Chapman, Concordia,

These schools will consider a wide variety of entrance requirements including:

Subject requirements including level of difficulty

GPA

Test Scores

Extracurricular Activities, Essays, Letters of Recommendation
