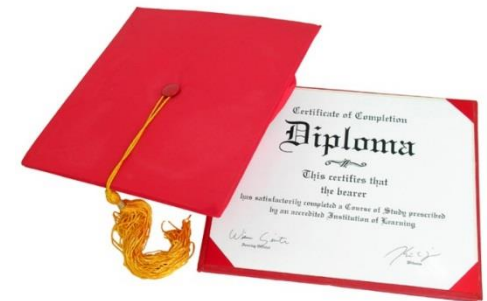

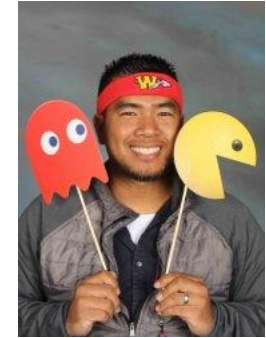

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College Admission Requirements

“a-g” Terminology

In order to be eligible to apply to a CSU/UC school or many private or out-of-state 4 year colleges, students must complete minimum admissions requirements which are called “a-g” courses. Studies also show that by completing these requirements, the success rate is higher for students who want to transfer from a community college to a four year college.

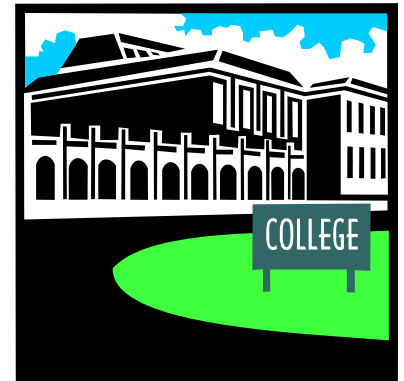
****4-year university bound students must pass all a-g courses with grades C- or higher.**

****D or F grades in required a-g courses may need to be remediated**

4 Year College Admission Requirements “a-g” Coursework

MINIMUM REQUIRED COURSES

- ▶ a – History/Social Science (2 years)
- ▶ b– English (4 years college prep English)
- ▶ c – Math (3 years through Alg 2 or Math 3, rec. 4 years)
- ▶ d – Lab Science (2 years, rec. 3rd)*
- ▶ e – World Language (2 years, rec. 3rd for UC)
- ▶ f – Visual and Performing Arts (1 year)
- ▶ g – College Prep Elective (1 year)



“a-g” Coursework Requirement Checklist

Not sure if you are on track to complete a-g coursework??

Use the a-g checklist along with your transcript:

- ▶ **Only include classes where you earned a C- or higher**
- ▶ **Include the classes you are taking this year.**



Senior Year

- ▶ **Stay Strong Academically!**
- ▶ **Focus on completing the “a-g” requirements.**
- ▶ **Consider an ROP class – it can help with college admissions and prepare you for a major or career. Check out the handout with class options!**
- ▶ **Dual Enrollment courses on the WHS campus – See flyer!!!**
- ▶ **It is important to take rigorous courses but do not overload – balance is key!**
- ▶ **Make sure you finish Health, Visual Performing Art, PE, etc.**

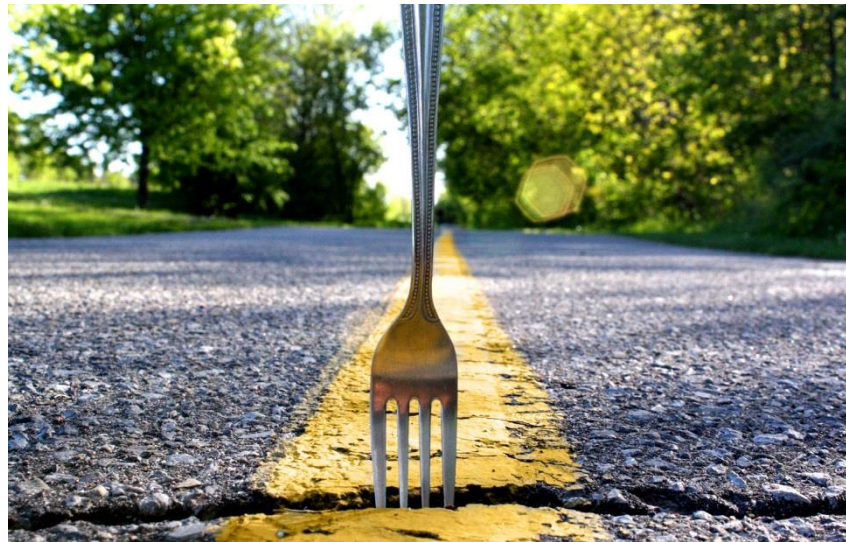

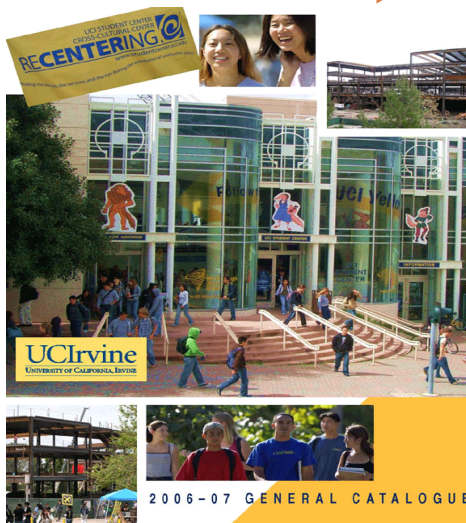
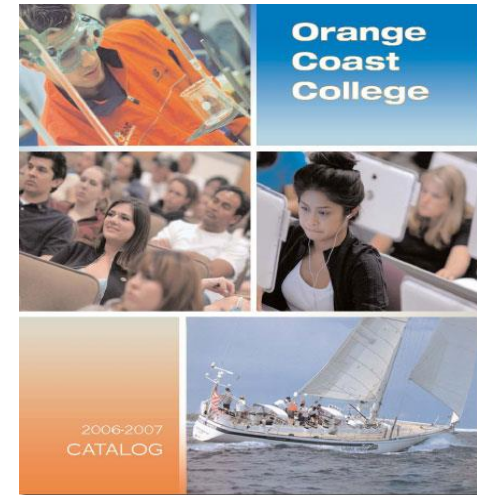
- Designed to give students the technical skills to prepare for a specific occupation
- Unlike four-year college, you don't graduate from a trade school with a bachelor's degree. Usually, upon completion of the program, you'll receive a diploma or trade certificate acknowledging you successfully finished.

Community colleges have a variety of career programs where you can earn a certificate and begin working in your chosen field.

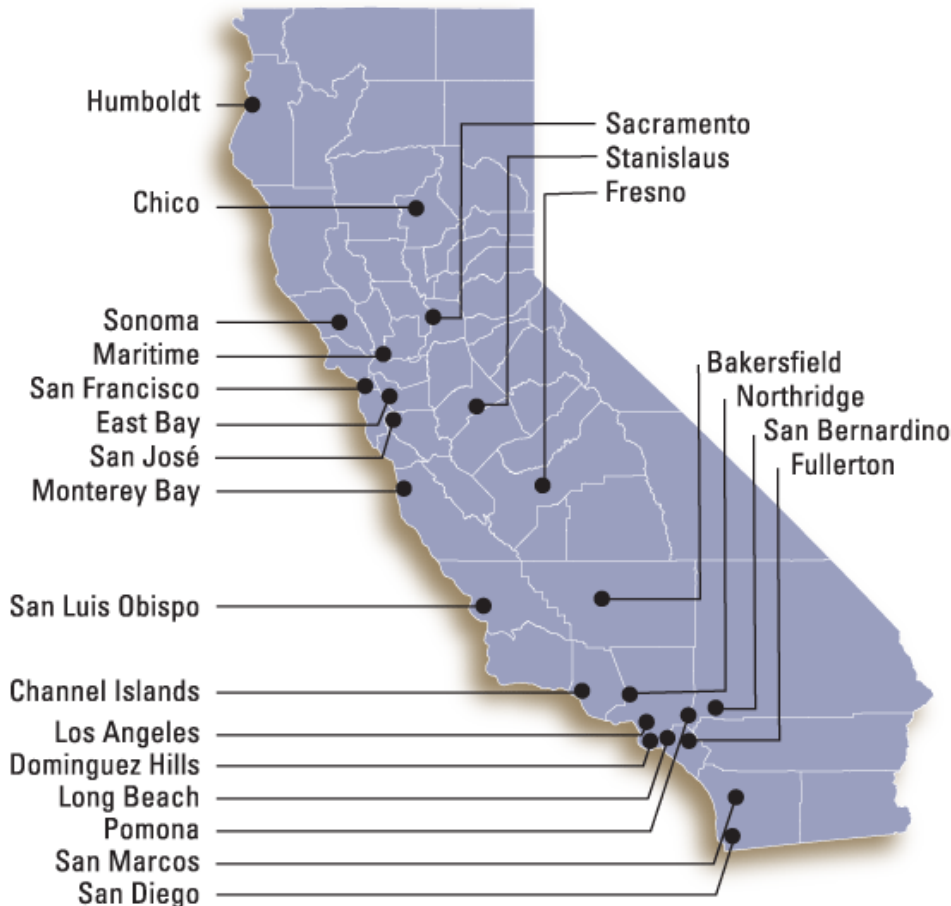

Admissions to Private Colleges

- ▶ **Every school has different requirements.**
- ▶ **It is up to YOU to investigate the schools YOU are interested in.**
- ▶ **Most schools accept the Common Application.**

- ▶ **If the college you are applying to requires supplemental documents, i.e. letters of recommendation and/or transcripts, you need to attend a College Application Assistance Workshop... held every Tuesday in the Fall Semester**

Applying Early

- ▶ Early Decision (ED) is binding
- ▶ Early Action (EA) is non-binding
- ▶ Restrictive Early Action (REA) means you may not apply to an EA, REA, or ED program at any private college/university in the US
- ▶ ***Does it increase my chance of acceptance?***
 - ▶ ***Colleges vary in percentage of early applicants they admit. A higher admission rate may correlate to stronger profiles among candidates choosing ED/EA.***

Create your list of schools

First, begin with a list of *potential schools*. On average, students are selecting **8-10 universities**. A recommended guideline is to have:

- **2-3 Reach Schools (10%-20% chance of admission)**
 - Within striking distance of GPA and test scores
 - Many factors are used in identifying admission
 -
- **3-4 Match or Target Schools (70%-80% chance of admission)**
 - GPA and Test Scores fall within or slightly above the school's average
- **1-2 Safety Schools (90%-100% chance of admission)**
 - GPA and Test Scores above the school's average
 - Make sure your safety school is actually a school you would attend!!!

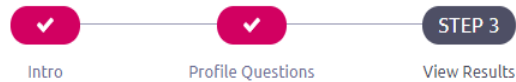

Overview

There are many challenging educational and training opportunities within the high-skilled world of Hospitality and Tourism. Learners need a solid background in math, science and technical skills. Education and training can be obtained in high schools, technical colleges/institutes and universities. Along the way, career guidance professionals assist learners in assessing their educational goals, interests, abilities and skills to facilitate a good match to the cluster's many pathway options. Learners participate in relevant educational opportunities framed in the context of the cluster. They gain knowledge and skills through coordinated workplace learning experiences such as site visits, job shadowing and internships. If they choose, they may achieve valuable skill certifications that lead to employment. Colleges and universities offer advanced degrees and industry certifications that prepare learners for professional and technical careers. The Hospitality and Tourism Cluster prepares learners for careers in the management, marketing and operations of restaurants and other food services, lodging, attractions, recreational events and travel-related services. Hospitality operations are located in communities throughout the world.

Employment Outlook

The hospitality and tourism industry directly supports over 5 million jobs and is one of the biggest job generators in the US, generating over 9 percent of the country's employment. Salaries depend on the employee's skills, education and job level at a hotel, restaurant, tourism office, recreation facility, amusement park or attraction site. Median annual salaries for these occupations range from \$18,330 for combined food preparation and serving workers to \$66,200 for gaming managers. This industry is known for promoting within and for its large number of young managers.
