COVID RESPONSE

In response to the pandemic, IUSD moved to a period of emergency distance learning with all schools closed to in-person instruction in Spring 2020. In order to eliminate the inevitable inequalities presented by emergency distance learning, WHS, in accordance with district policies, awarded students marks of credit/no credit only, for the final reporting period.

WHS students had the option of continuing in distance learning throughout the 2020-2021 & 2021-2022 school year. WHS students who selected to continue in the distance-learning format show grades earned from San Joaquin High School on official transcripts. Letter grades awarded during 2020-2021 and moving forward, reverted back to the regular grading system noted below.

On July 1, 2021, The California Legislature passed Assembly Bill [AB] 104. AB 104 allows students the option to receive grades of "Pass/No Pass" for one or more courses in the 2020-2021 school year at student discretion.

On July 9, 2021, The California Legislature passed AB 130. In the 2021-2022 school year, AB 130 mandates distance learning students the ability to return to their home high school within five days of a request. As a result, class size, demographics, and other information pertaining to this profile will vary throughout the current school year.

CAMPUS INFORMATION

Students attend with all of their courses on Mondays, and on an alternating block schedule Tuesday through Friday. Students are limited to 6 courses per semester with the exception of those enrolled in "open enrollment" courses. Open enrollment courses include athletics, performing arts, Theatre Tech., Leadership, Yearbook, and Art of TV and Video.

Woodbridge is one of five comprehensive high schools in the Irvine Unified School District in the city of Irvine, California, a suburban, mostly residential community in the central coastal region of Orange County. <u>26% of students qualify for the free/reduced lunch program</u>. GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Irvine Unified School District requires two hundred fifteen credits earned in grades 9 - 12 in various subjects and academic disciplines including 20 credits (four semesters) of Physical Education and 5 credits (one semester) of Health. GRADING SYSTEM

The marking system is based on a 4.0 scale for the grade of A. Plus or minus marks are not computed. Honors courses in grades eleven and twelve, and all Advanced Placement courses receive one extra grade point when the grade earned is a C or above. **Class rank is not computed per IUSD District Policy**. A passing grade for high school credit is a D-.

COURSE OFFERINGS (All AP courses and underlined honors courses are weighted)

Woodbridge high school offers 122 a-g college preparatory courses which includes 26 Advanced Placement Courses: AP Human Geography, AP World History, AP US History, AP US Government & Politices, AP Macro Economics, AP Micro Economics, AP English Language, AP English Literature, AP Statistics, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Physics 1, AP Physics 2, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science, AP Latin, AP Spanish, AP Chinese, AP Computer Science, AP Computer Science Principles, AP Psychology, AP Drawing, AP 2D Art, AP 3D Studio Art, and AP Art History. The following Honors Courses are also available: Honors English 1, <u>Honors American Literature</u>, Enhanced Math 2, <u>Enhanced Math 3</u>, <u>Honors Pre-Calculus</u>, Honors Living Earth, <u>Honors Chemistry in the Earth Systems, Honors Latin 3, Honors Spanish 4</u>, Computer Science: <u>Data Structures</u>.

CLASS OF 2023 RANK AND GPA INFORMATION

Irvine Unified School District does <u>NOT</u> rank students. Woodbridge High School will provide percentile range rankings when requested by universities and scholarship organizations.

CONCURRENT INSTRUCTION AND INTERNATIONAL RECORDS POLICIES

Irvine Unified District guidelines state that credit will be granted for coursework completed at an institution recognized by the U.S. Department of Education (i.e., WASC). Independent study and online courses are issued a grade of "P" Pass or "F" Fail only. <u>31.6% of the Class of 2022</u> opted to take at least one class through local community colleges. Many students choose to take college classes to earn transferable college credit. Coursework completed at the community college, with rare exception, does not appear on the Woodbridge High School transcript.

Students with international records will receive a "P" Pass or "F" Fail grade on their Woodbridge High School transcript for courses taken outside the United States. Students are encouraged to provide a copy of their original international records directly to colleges and universities for grade interpretation as warranted.

ATHLETIC PROGRAM

Woodbridge High School is a member of the Pacific Coast League which is governed by the Southern Section of the California Interscholastic Federation. Over 1200 student athletes, approximately 50% of our school, participate in some form of interscholastic competition. Sportsmanship, team-work and integrity are core values which are stressed at every level of participation. Sports teams include: cross country, track, softball, baseball, golf, tennis, volleyball, basketball, football, water polo, swimming, wrestling, soccer and lacrosse.
